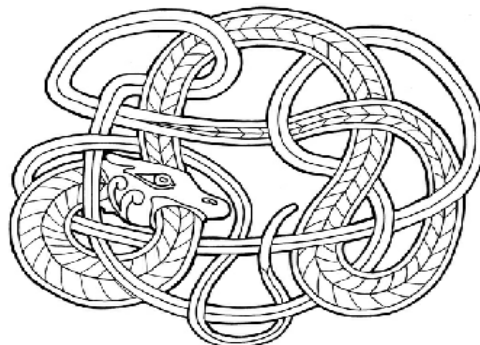

Greetings and salutations,



I submitted three names and devices that were done at Herald's Point at Pennsic and have received the results of them. I figured that I would share some of the information from this process. It has been a learning experience for me and will help with the other submissions that I am very, very slowly working on for others. These were submitted in September and since they were done at Herald's Point at Pennsic did not have to go through the internal letter of intent process here in Ealdormere. So it took approximately 5-6 months for the names and devices to go through the whole trip. If they had to go through the internal letter it would probably add at least a month or two. Of the three names and devices, all three names and two of the devices passed. These names and devices are as follows:

Sam Hardie

Name: Dmitri Kievskoi

Device: Quarterly per fess embattled sable and vert, in bend sinister an escallop and a bear's head erased Or.

Jennifer Etty

Name: Gema Krasil'nikova

Lorena Hebert

Name: Morighane MacDermott

Device: Gules crusily Celtic, on a chief Or three boar's heads erased sable.

(For actual use Lorena would prefer people to continue to use Morrigan McDermott.)

Gema had her device sent back for redrawing. Although the artwork was done by people working at Herald's Point it was felt that the leaf did not contain enough detail and that the knitting needles were out of period as they had knobs at the end instead of being double pointed. I thought it would be worth including in this so that anyone submitting a device will know to try and be as accurate and period authentic in their drawing of the device to hopefully avoid a situation like this.

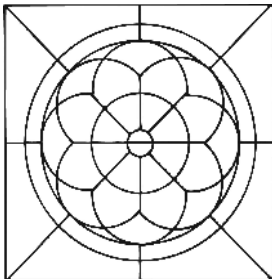
