From the Board of Directors

During the July 28, 2020, meeting of the Board of Directors for the Society for Creative Anachronism, the following Resolution was passed by a unanimous vote and made effective immediately: Resolution to Suspend In-Person SCA Activity until January 31st, 2021



Highlights:

- 1. The Board of Directors acknowledges the health and well-being of the membership and participants of the SCA are of utmost importance;
- 2. The Crowns of the vast majority of North American Kingdoms have petitioned the board to suspend in-person SCA events in North America until January 31st, 2021, which is generally supported; It was resolved that the SCA Board of Directors suspends all SCA in-person events in North America until January 31st, 2021;
- 3. Small local gatherings including, but not limited to, archery practice, guild meetings, officer meetings, and local martial activities shall remain at the discretion of the Crown and Kingdom Seneschal, in accordance with CDC, State, Provincial, and local health guidelines and recommendations. Virtual events as alternatives continue to be a viable option;
- 4. Society Seneschal has granted a blanket variance waiving any required events such as Crown List and Coronation until January 31st, 2021, as well as extending all current reigns until a royal list can be held to determine suitable Heirs (Long live King Amelius Claudius Rattanicus and Queen Isabel Atwyll. Wassail!!).
- 5. If a coronet steps down without Heirs for a Kingdom or Principality, a Regent shall be installed until such time as a royal list may be held to find suitable Heirs and a Coronation or Investiture held. This regent should be installed according to the Kingdom or Principality laws that govern the appointment of Regents, after consultation with the Society Seneschal. If the Kingdom or Principality has no such law, the Kingdom Seneschal (and Principality Seneschal when appropriate) must consult with the Society Seneschal and Society President to determine an appropriate selection method for a Regent;

- 6. Kingdoms who have determined that it is safe to host in-person events before January 31st, 2021, must request a variance from the Society Seneschal to be able to do so. The Society Seneschal shall have the authority to grant or deny these requests. These requests will be reviewed by the Board using the same review method used for variances to Corpora;
- 7. SCA Board of Directors commends the officers, royalty, hard-working membership, and participants who have made it possible for the SCA to continue activities during these trying times.

Becoming an Apprentice in the SCA

On Saturday, October 2, 2020 (A.S. 55), did Rhys of Angelsey become an apprentice to Magistra Sciath ingen Chaennaig, Baroness of Rising Waters. This was witnessed by many, including Their Majesties, King Amelius Claudius Rattanicus and Queen Isabel Atwyll; Magistra Nicolaa de Bracton, and Lady Bera Oddsdottir (now belt-sister to Rhys).

Many words of advice and congratulations were given to the new apprentice.

Afterwards, news of the event was spread unto the Kingdom of Ealdormere, via the Book of Faces.



A quick word from Rhys ap Anglesey, new apprentice

As a fairly new SCAdian, I feel that becoming an apprentice to someone with experience would be a significantly advantageous endeavour. My Mistress is able to help guide me in directions that I would not necessarily think of myself. She also would be able to provide contacts for any interests I have that she is unable to assist with. My hope is that with the guidance of my Mistress I can become a better player in this great game and to deepen my understanding of the Medieval period. In addition, I, aspire to, one day, if appropriate, become a Laurel myself. I feel that becoming an apprentice to Magistra Sciath ingen Chaennaig will assist me greatly in this long-term goal.

This occasion provides us with the opportunity to explore this type of relationship further!

What is an Apprentice?

An apprentice is an individual who forms a formal relationship with a Master or Mistress of the Order of the Laurel. A master, or mistress, is an individual who has been recognized as meeting a Known World standard of mastery in knowledge and performance of techniques in an art or science. An apprenticeship can take many forms and has different aspects, many of which depend on the apprentice and master/mistress. Each pairing is a unique relationship.

Fealty

Apprenticeships are predominantly a fealty-based relationship, although not every relationship will make this explicit. In my opinion, it is important to have that fealty relationship, because then there is a formal agreement, both on the part of the laurel and on the part of the apprentice. Fealty becomes personal and for some people, very intense. Through fealty, the apprentice knows that they can depend on their laurel and that they have a personal relationship, meaning that they can contact the laurel any time, and will probably even have priority in the various demands on a laurel's time. Laurels, as peers, are bound and committed to teaching anyone, but they usually feel the personal relationship with their apprentices is special and so they give it a priority and extra care. Not all laurels require fealty from their apprentices.

The apprentice relationship involves a deeper personal relationship (and commitment) and covers all the other aspects of being a peer. The opportunity for a frank and honest discussion about peerage, its qualities, requirements, and meanings, is important. Equally important is my willingness to support and encourage my apprentices. Because they are my apprentices, I feel that they have made the commitment to learn and improve, and I have no qualms about encouraging them. Everyone needs a push now and then, and I try to provide that for my apprentices. The relationship we have includes my guiding them towards peerage in any field.

What is the purpose of being an apprentice?

Each apprentice in this relationship has their own purpose for engaging with a laurel. I have two apprentices and have different relationships with each of them. The purpose of being an apprentice may include receiving the guidance, mentorship, teaching, encouragement, and honest feedback on the path to becoming a laurel in their own right. Whatever the reason, both apprentice and laurel need to be understood.

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What are the duties of the apprentice?

This depends entirely on the people involved. There are no real guidelines or rules in this regard. Each teacher-apprentice pair defines the duties on their own. In most cases, laurels expect their apprentices to

- 1. Have an honest desire to learn, not only a particular craft, but the various peerage attributes, qualities, and attitudes. To ultimately move on from apprenticeship and earn the accolade of a peer, you must know a little about a lot of things, a lot about four or five things. Learning is the number one duty of an apprentice.
- 2. Motivate the laurel to do things and work on projects by providing eagerness and energy, time together and regular contact.
- 3. Honestly, an aspiration for a peerage (eventually), and be willing to work toward it by teaching their chosen craft, sharing their knowledge with others for the enrichment of the kingdom, and applying things learned to their own skills, attitudes, and philosophies.

What is the "position" of an apprentice?

Apprentice is NOT a title. It is a job description. Apprenticeship means that you are in a fealty-based relationship pledged to the pursuit of knowledge and excellence (of execution) in a particular art or science, while learning and practicing all the aspects and virtues of the chivalric ideal of a peer.

What does the apprentice bring to the relationship?

They bring enthusiasm, motivation and energy. Depending on the relationship they provide new information or a new way of looking at things. Laurels do not have a monopoly on knowledge and many times learn things from their apprentices. This is a good thing, and can certainly be a challenge and motivation for the apprentice to find the "one thing that their laurel didn't know".

How do you become an apprentice?

The simple answer is that it begins by expressing your desire to become a laurel or the laurel approaches you because they think you have expressed an interest in or a desire to learn a certain craft. The complete answer is a little more lengthy, and just because you express your desire doesn't mean you will automatically become an apprentice. There should be much discussion about and exploration of all the aspects of the relationship, the expectations (on both sides), the teaching style, and the desired end goal. Some people wind up apprenticed to a laurel that

they really don't get along with and who has different core values, and this can be a major problem. Some laurels have very high expectations on the amount of time they expect their apprentices to spend either on their projects, or hanging out doing SCA stuff at the laurel's house, or at events. If this is different that what the apprentice has in mind, then again the end result is a conflict. Terminating a relationship in this type can be painful for both.

Some laurels start out with students that later become apprentices. This can be useful for both individuals to give them time to get to know each other, sample each other's style of communication and conduct, and see how well they work together. If the laurel knows the person well already, they may skip the student stage and go directly to apprenticing. If, as a student, everything else seems to be working to mutual benefit and enjoyment, they can make this a fealty relationship. I like this approach because it also fits with my classification of a student as someone who has not made a fealty commitment to me. Perhaps they are in fealty to someone else, we haven't reached that point yet, or they don't want that commitment, and they merely want to learn what I can teach with no strings attached.

Are there things that laurels and potential apprentices should talk about before making the relationship formal or official? I believe that are several key items the two individuals should discuss prior to making the relationship official. Most of them are the same basic questions I have tried to address here, including:

- What expectations does the potential apprentice have for an apprenticeship relationship?
- How much time does the apprentice hope to spend with the laurel, both events and non-events?
- What does the apprentice want to get out of the relationship?
- What does the apprentice think the laurel will contribute?
- What will the apprentice think he/she will contribute?
- What are the potential apprentices hopes, goals, and objectives?
- Why does the apprentice think that this laurel is the best laurel to apprentice to?
- What teaching style does the potential apprentice prefer? Specifically assigned projects or meandering through the craft and merely coming back from time to time for comments on the latest project? Is this preference OK with the laurel?




What about the "apprenticing" ceremony?

This process does not need to take place in court. The ceremony is an item that differs from kingdom to kingdom, and even from peer to peer within a given kingdom. Some people like to take apprentices in court. I prefer to conduct this process in a place where it may be witnessed by persons of note, and those who are significant to both apprentice and laurel.

Some people expect oaths and ceremonies, some don't. I prefer oath-taking, as this is reminiscent of the medieval apprenticeship process. For me, the ceremony usually involves oath-taking and gift-giving, witnessed by others.



The Spinner, Quirijn van Brekelenkam 1653




On November 14th The Barony of Rising Waters will be will be hosting a one-day online educational event called <u>The Seminars of Saint Antoninus</u>.
