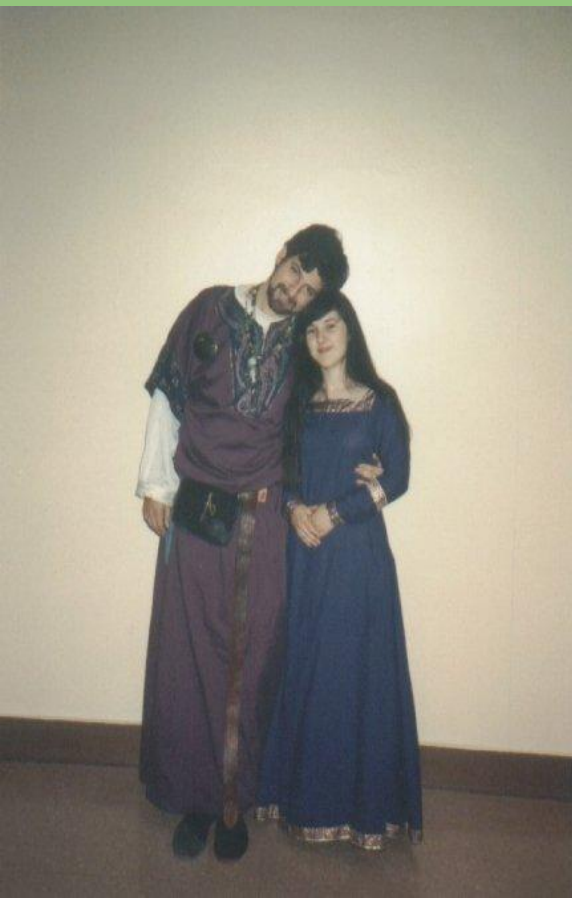
**Lord Thomas the

What is it like to step away from the Society for decades and then return? This wasn't a question I thought I would be able to answer, but here we are, and I find myself in that situation.

In the 80s and 90s I was very active in the SCA. I was seneschal of Eoforwic during its Decennial celebration, Lord Mayor of the City, and at various times chronicler, autocrat (for the 100 Years War event), feastocrat (for the second Venetian event of AS 28) and filled various other offices. During this period I would occasionally see various pillars of the community drift away, to be rarely seen again and I did not understand it. How could someone who had centred their life around the SCA just drift away? It made no sense. Then it happened to me.

In the mid-90s, I started to drift away myself. My wife and I were self-publishing a comic book and spending most weekends at comic book conventions. The SCA started to move into the background. We attended fewer and fewer events and meetings. And I discovered that the SCA is a habit. When you keep it up, it is easy. When you fall out of the habit, it is no longer part of the routine. Then it is much more difficult. You don't have, as a matter of course, meeting nights and weekends free. You have to remind yourself to attend and you do that less and less often.

We came back for a bit in the mid-00s. We had a couple of young children and would bring them to events and Pennsic (where my wife had a close friend from far away that we loved to see). But then life got more busy and it faded away again.



I returned about a year and a half ago. Part of it was that I am retired now and have more time. Part of it was that I knew that the 50th was approaching and was interested in being there for that. This time, I determined to make it a habit again, part of the routine. So I made sure to set aside time to attend the weekly meetings (and, living on the Cliffs, I try and attend the Ard Chreag meetings, too). It is still tough to get that second weekly evening to attend fight practices, but I mean to do that, too. And I am attending events more. The more you do, the easier it is to do more.

What is it like seeing Septentria and Ealdormere after so many years of absence? Weird. The Septentria I know best, the one I spent the vast majority of my SCA time in, was presided over by Baron Aedan and Baroness Caffa and was much larger. (So was Eoforwic, which is also taking some getting used to.) It was part of the Middle Kingdom. My first impression was “There are so many freakin’ knights!” I used to be able to count the knights on the fingers of one hand and have some left over.

Returning after decades, there are a lot of well-established people I don’t know and I’m enjoying becoming acquainted with. Connecting with people who go back decades, however, is easy, as we have shared experiences that not so many others do. The past is fresher for me, though, as I don’t have the decades of Ealdormere experience to make it blurrier. I started the #ThrowbackThursday posts to try and lure out some of my old friends, who had also drifted away. But I am continuing them. I think they can help bridge the present to the past for others.

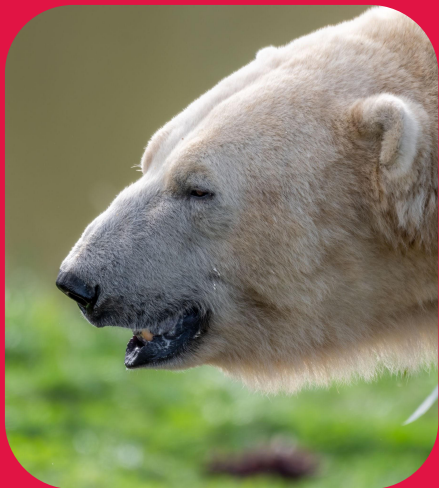


Some things haven't changed. There is still the focus on service, a wide variety of arts pursued and encouraged, and martial activities remain a draw and a centre of activity for many. People still have fun in many of the same ways. Septentria is still a very "down to earth" barony. I can still see the influence of Aedan and Caffa on our culture, all these decades later.

One major change I've noticed is, of course, the shift to online channels for communications. Everything seems to be Facebook and Discord these days. This isn't a bad thing. I use and enjoy these channels. But I miss the Canton newsletters and address lists. I've been reading the old chronicles recently and I think future ones are going to be harder to write without those newsletters. We've gained a lot here, but I think we've lost something, too.

Another major change I've noticed, and appreciate, is that the Society in these parts is much more inclusive now. People are more comfortable bringing and expressing their full selves to events. That's a great change, one without a downside.
